

Board Games Social Group



Our boardgames social group encourages the development and use of communication, social skills and team work through playing boardgames.

During boardgames, children will work together collaboratively to complete tasks that are required to finish the game.

Children are often specifically grouped and matched based on compatibility of age, developmental level, diagnosis and so on with a consideration to the dynamics of the group.

Sessions are facilitated by therapist(s) with an understanding of working with children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and/or developmental or social skills difficulties to help support skills such as sharing, turn-taking, collaboration, conflict resolution, and verbal and non-verbal communication.

At boardgames social group, your child will learn to:

- Use problem-solving, teamwork
- and negotiation skills
- Use conversational skills (asking and answering questions and commenting)
- Use range of ways to relate with others
- Share, take turns and use joint attention skills
- Identify non-verbal language cues
- Be a good sport
- Use procedural language and temporal concepts
- Interpret and understand rules of the game and explain to others
